# MAX ANGELELLI

## *Career Highlights*

### 2017

- Retired from driving after debuting the all-new No. 10 Konica Minolta Cadillac DPi-V.R at the season-opening Rolex 24 At Daytona and scoring a resounding victory with brothers Ricky and Jordan Taylor and four-time NASCAR Cup Series champion Jeff Gordon.
- It was his second career Rolex 24 victory, the first coming in 2005 enroute to that year's championship, and the 28<sup>th</sup> of his career – third-most in North American sportscar racing history behind Scott Pruett's 43 and Memo Rojas' 29.
- Continued in his role as program manager for the Cadillac DPi-V.R effort, which also includes the Nos. 5 and 31 Action Express Racing prototypes for drivers Christian Fittipaldi, Joao Barbosa, Dane Cameron and Eric Curran.

### 2016

- Part-time co-driver with brothers Ricky and Jordan Taylor in the No. 10 Konica Minolta Corvette DP for Wayne Taylor Racing in the IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship's four-race championship-within-a-championship – the Tequila Patron North American Endurance Cup – for the third year in a row. The championship is made up of the Rolex 24 At Daytona, the Mobil 1 Twelve Hours of Sebring, the Sahlen's Six Hours of The Glen, and the Petit Le Mans.
- Co-drove to top finishes of second at the season-opening Rolex 24 At Daytona, and third at the season-ending Petit Le Mans at Road Atlanta.
- Worked intensely with manufacturers Cadillac, Dallara and Earnhardt Childress Engines in helping to design and develop the all-new Cadillac DPi-V.R racecar to be introduced in 2017 in the IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship Prototype class.

### 2015

- Continued as part-time co-driver with brothers Ricky and Jordan Taylor in the No. 10 Konica Minolta Corvette DP for Wayne Taylor Racing in the IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship's four-race championship-within-a-championship – the Tequila Patron North American Endurance Cup. The championship is made up of the Rolex 24 At Daytona, the Mobil 1 Twelve Hours of Sebring, the Sahlen's Six Hours of The Glen, and the Petit Le Mans.
- Co-drove to a top finish of second at Sebring after the team's runner-up finish at the season-opening Rolex 24 was declared a 16<sup>th</sup>-place result due to a maximum drive-time infraction.
- Also posted finishes of sixth at Watkins Glen in June and fourth in a rain-shortened Petit Le Mans at Road Atlanta in October.

### 2014

- Moved from full-time co-driver role to part-time driver alongside Wayne Taylor Racing full-timers Ricky and Jordan Taylor in the four Tequila Patron North American Endurance Cup events.
- Co-drove to a runner-up finish at the season-opening Rolex 24 At Daytona with Ricky and Jordan Taylor, as well as team owner Wayne Taylor.
- Co-drove to a seventh-place finish in the Mobil 1 Twelve Hours of Sebring and a fifth-place finish in the Watkins Glen Six-Hour in June.
- Closed the season with a dominating victory in the Petit Le Mans to help the team finish second in the season-long championship.

## 2013

- Captured his second career GRAND-AM Rolex Sports Car Series driver championship in his seventh season with Wayne Taylor Racing and his 10<sup>th</sup> season in the series.
- Co-drove for the first time with team owner Wayne Taylor's younger son Jordan Taylor and clinched the championship in dominating fashion by winning for the third, fourth and fifth time at the season's final three events at Kansas Speedway in Kansas City, Mazda Raceway Laguna Seca near Monterey, Calif., and Lime Rock Park in Lakeville, Conn.
- Scored victories earlier in the season at Barber Motorsports Park in Birmingham, Ala., in April and on the Belle Isle street course in downtown Detroit in June.
- The victory at the Lime Rock season finale was his fourth in a row at the New England racetrack, a Rolex Series record.
- Opened the season with a solid runner-up finish at the Rolex 24 At Daytona.
- The five wins gave Angelelli 26 for his Rolex Series career, keeping him third on the all-time series list behind Scott Pruett (41) and Memo Rojas (27).

## 2012

- Competed in the full GRAND-AM Rolex Sports Car Series schedule for SunTrust Racing, campaigned by Wayne Taylor Racing for the sixth year, finishing fifth in the final team and driver standings.
- Joined by full-time co-driver Ricky Taylor – team owner Wayne Taylor's eldest son – for the third year in a row and scored three wins and four podium finishes.
- Two wins came in back-to-back fashion at Homestead-Miami Speedway in April and New Jersey Motorsports Park in Millville in May.
- The third win came at the 13<sup>th</sup> and final race of the season at Lime Rock Park in Lakeville, Conn., keeping the team a perfect three-for-three at the 1.5-mile road course the past three seasons.
- Finished third in the series' inaugural race at Indianapolis Motor Speedway in July. Has 60 career podium finishes.
- The three wins gave Angelelli 21 for his Rolex Series career, keeping him third on the all-time series list behind Scott Pruett (38) and Memo Rojas (25).

## 2011

- Competed in the full GRAND-AM Rolex Sports Car Series schedule for SunTrust Racing, campaigned by Wayne Taylor Racing for the fifth year, finishing second in the final team and driver standings for the second year in a row.
- Joined by full-time co-driver Ricky Taylor for the second year in a row and scored the most wins (three), podium finishes (eight), pole positions (six) and laps led (614) for SunTrust Racing since the 2005 Rolex Series championship campaign.
- Scored a Memorial Day victory at Lime Rock Park for the second year in a row, and followed five days later with the SunTrust team's first-ever win in the prestigious Sahlen's Six Hours of The Glen at Watkins Glen (N.Y.) International. The third win of the second came in the two-hour sprint race at Watkins Glen during the August NASCAR weekend.
- The three wins gave him 18 for his Rolex Series career, placing him third on the all-time series list behind Scott Pruett (36) and Memo Rojas (23).

## 2010

- Competed in the full GRAND-AM Rolex Sports Car Series schedule for SunTrust Racing, campaigned by Wayne Taylor Racing for the fourth year, finishing second in the final team and driver standings.
- Joined by full-time co-driver Ricky Taylor and scored a Memorial Day victory at Lime Rock Park and seven podium finishes overall.
- Qualified on the pole at the season-opening Rolex 24 At Daytona, where he and Ricky Taylor co-drove with Wayne Taylor and former Formula One competitor Pedro Lamy of Portugal to a sixth-place finish.

## 2009

- Competed in the full GRAND-AM Rolex Sports Car Series schedule for SunTrust Racing, campaigned by Wayne Taylor Racing for the third year, finishing third in the final team and driver standings.
- Joined by full-time co-driver Brian Frisselle, scored victories at the July 4 Brumos Porsche 250 at Daytona (Fla.) International Speedway and for the second time in his career on Montreal's Circuit Gilles Villeneuve in August. Upped his career victory total to 14, maintaining the second spot on the Rolex Series all-time career victories list behind leader Scott Pruett's 23.
- Added podium finishes at Virginia International Raceway in Alton, New Jersey Motorsports Park, Mazda Raceway Laguna Seca in Monterey, Calif., and Miller Motorsports Park in Tooele, Utah.

## 2008

- Competed in the full GRAND-AM Rolex Sports Car Series schedule for SunTrust Racing, campaigned by Wayne Taylor Racing for the second year, finishing sixth in the final team point standings and sixth in the final driver standings.
- Joined by full-time co-driver Michael Valiante, scored the season's lone victory from the pole at Sonoma (Calif.) Raceway. Added podium finishes at the Sahlen's Six Hours at The Glen, New Jersey Motorsports Park and Miller Motorsports Park.

**2007**

- Competed in the full GRAND-AM Rolex Sports Car Series schedule for SunTrust Racing, campaigned by Wayne Taylor Racing for the first time. Helped the team finish third in the championship point standings, SunTrust's fourth consecutive top-three finish in the team standings since joining the series in 2004.
- Finished third in the Rolex Sports Car Series driver standings.
- Scored a pair of Rolex Series victories, co-driving with Jan Magnussen, at Virginia International Raceway and the Circuit Gilles Villeneuve.
- Totaled nine podium finishes, and 11 top-fives and 12 top-10s in all in 14 events.

**2006**

- Competed in the full GRAND-AM Rolex Sports Car Series schedule for SunTrust Racing. Helped the team finish third in the championship point standings.
- Finished third in the Rolex Sports Car Series driver standings.
- Accumulated nine top-five finishes during the 14-race Rolex Sports Car Series schedule.
- Won Rolex Sports Car Series race at Mazda Raceway Laguna Seca with co-driver Jan Magnussen.
- Competed in two International Race of Champions (IROC) events at Texas Motor Speedway and Daytona International Speedway, respectively. Finished sixth at Texas and seventh at the Daytona road course. The Texas IROC event was Angelelli's first race on an oval in a front-engine race car.

**2005**

- Won the prestigious Rolex 24 Hours At Daytona with co-drivers Wayne Taylor and Emmanuel Collard.
- Shared Rolex Sports Car Series driver championship with teammate Taylor.
- Helped capture the Rolex Sports Car Series team championship, as SunTrust Racing completed every lap in series competition.
- Won the Grand Prix of Miami with co-driver Taylor in the second-closest finish in Rolex Sports Car Series history by beating Butch Leitzinger to the line by just 1.198 seconds.
- With two wins to start the season at Daytona and Miami, Angelelli and Taylor became just the second set of co-drivers to win the first two races of the season in Rolex Sports Car Series history. Mauro Baldi and Didier Theys were the only other teammates to sweep the first two races of a season, accomplishing the feat in 2002.
- Won at Barber Motorsports Park in Birmingham, Ala., with Taylor.
- Won at Watkins Glen in August with Taylor.
- Captured series-high fifth win of the season at Watkins Glen in September with Taylor.
- Named to the American Auto Racing Writers and Broadcasters Association (AARWBA) All America First-Team.

**2004**

- First year of competition with SunTrust Racing in the Rolex Sports Car Series. Helped the team finish second in the championship point standings.
- Finished fourth in the Rolex Sports Car Series driver standings.
- Captured first ever Rolex Sports Car Series win at Phoenix with Wayne Taylor.
- Won at Daytona in July with Taylor.
- Won third race of the year at Virginia International Raceway in the VIR 400 presented by SunTrust with Taylor.
- Accumulated 10 top-five finishes during the 12-race Rolex Sports Car Series schedule.
- Competed in a Cadillac CTS-V in the Speed World Challenge GT Series. Won twice, captured two poles and finished third in championship.

- Worked with Cadillac as a test driver to develop the Cadillac CTS-V race car.

**2002**

- Earned four podium finishes for Cadillac in the American Le Mans Series (ALMS) with Wayne Taylor as a teammate.

**2001**

- Competed for Cadillac in the ALMS with Wayne Taylor.

- Competed in his first season in the Italian Formula Alfa Boxer Championship, finishing eighth in the championship standings.

**1985**

- Competed in his very first auto race, the Vado-Monzuno hill climb, at the age of 15 in his father's A122.
- Took part in first single-seater race in the Formula Fiat Abarth race at Imola. Finished fourth among 30 drivers.
