



Stewart-Haas Racing: NASCAR Timeline

April 25, 2008	During a media session at Talladega (Ala.) Superspeedway, Tony Stewart acknowledges that he has offers from other teams to drive that include acquiring an equity stake in the organization when his contract with Joe Gibbs Racing comes to an end.
July 9, 2008	Stewart and Joe Gibbs Racing officials announce that they will part ways at the end of the 2008 NASCAR Cup Series season.
July 10, 2008	In a press conference at Chicagoland Speedway in Joliet, Illinois, Stewart announces that in 2009 he will serve as driver/owner of Stewart-Haas Racing (SHR). The team will be co-owned by Stewart and Gene Haas, founder of Oxnard, California-based Haas Automation, which owned Haas CNC Racing. The team will receive chassis, engines and technical support from Hendrick Motorsports.
July 25, 2008	Stewart announces he will drive the No. 14 Chevrolet in 2009 with sponsorship from Office Depot and Old Spice. The press conference takes place at the IMS Productions studios across from Indianapolis Motor Speedway.
Aug. 15, 2008	In a press conference at Michigan International Speedway in Brooklyn, Stewart announces that Ryan Newman will be his teammate at SHR and drive the No. 4 Chevrolet beginning in 2009.
Aug. 19, 2008	Stewart announces on SIRIUS' "Tony Stewart Live" that Newman will drive the No. 39 Chevrolet instead of the No. 4. Morgan-McClure Motorsports, which had used the No. 4 for several years in NASCAR competition, asked to keep the number for future use. Stewart and Newman opted for No. 39, the number Newman used to score his first United State Auto Club (USAC) victory.
Sept. 5, 2008	Hendrick Motorsports' veteran engineer Darian Grubb is named Stewart's crew chief for the No. 14 Office Depot/Old Spice Chevrolet.
Oct. 9, 2008	U.S. Army officials announce they will sponsor Newman in the No. 39 Chevrolet for 22 point-paying races in 2009, along with the non-point NASCAR All-Star race at Charlotte (N.C.) Motor Speedway. The announcement is made in a press conference at Charlotte Motor Speedway.
Nov. 14, 2008	Bobby Hutchens is announced as director of competition for SHR, while Tony Gibson is named Newman's crew chief for the No. 39 team.

Nov. 17, 2008	Grubb, Gibson and Hutchens begin working at SHR.
Dec. 17, 2008	Newman and Gibson test at North Carolina Speedway in Rockingham. It is the first-ever on-track activity for SHR.
Jan. 14, 2009	Stewart and Newman test at New Smyrna (Fla.) Speedway. It marks the first test for Stewart and Grubb at SHR, and the first test where the Nos. 14 and 39 teams test together.
Jan. 21, 2009	SHR officials announce that Burger King will sponsor Stewart's No. 14 Chevrolet in two races in 2009.
Feb. 4, 2009	SHR's two transporters leave the team's Kannapolis, N.C.-based shop at exactly 1:08 p.m. EST bound for Daytona (Fla.) International Speedway.
Feb. 6, 2009	Stewart drives the No. 14 Old Spice/Office Depot Chevrolet during Budweiser Shootout practice at Daytona International Speedway. It marks the first official on-track activity for SHR.
Feb. 7, 2009	Stewart and Newman participate in Daytona 500 practice. Stewart finishes third in the non-points Budweiser Shootout.
Feb. 8, 2009	Newman and Stewart place both SHR cars within the top-10 during Daytona 500 time trials. Newman posts the third-quickest time and Stewart notches the 10 th -fastest time.
Feb. 12, 2009	Stewart finishes second in his Gatorade Duel race at Daytona, earning the best finish for SHR.
Feb. 15, 2009	Stewart and Newman finish eighth and 36 th , respectively, in the Daytona 500 – SHR's first points-paying race.
March 29, 2009	SHR places both of its cars among the top-10 in a race for the first time. Stewart finishes third and Newman finishes sixth in the Goody's Fast Pain Relief 500 at Martinsville (Va.) Speedway.
May 2, 2009	SHR places both of its cars among the top-five in a race for the first time. Stewart finishes second and Newman finishes fourth in the Crown Royal 400 at Richmond (Va.) International Raceway.
May 16, 2009	Stewart scores first NASCAR Cup Series victory for SHR in the non-points NASCAR All-Star race at Charlotte Motor Speedway.
May 21, 2009	Newman scores first NASCAR Cup Series pole for SHR in the Coca-Cola 600 at Charlotte Motor Speedway (28.651 seconds at 188.475 mph). It is Newman's eighth Cup Series pole at Charlotte and his 44 th career Cup Series pole.

<p>May 31, 2009</p>	<p>With a second-place finish in the Autism Speaks 400 at Dover (Del.) International Speedway, Stewart takes the lead in the NASCAR Cup Series championship standings by 46 points over second-place Jeff Gordon. It marks the first time a driver/owner has led the points since Alan Kulwicki beat Bill Elliott for the championship on Nov. 15, 1992 at Atlanta Motor Speedway – a span of 556 races.</p> <p>Newman is fifth in points, marking the first time both SHR drivers have been in the top-five in points.</p>
<p>June 7, 2009</p>	<p>Stewart scores first points-paying NASCAR Cup Series victory for SHR by winning the Pocono 500 at Pocono (Pa.) Raceway by 2.004 seconds over second-place Carl Edwards. It marks the first time a driver/owner has won a points-paying Cup Series race since Ricky Rudd on Sept. 27, 1998 at Martinsville.</p> <p>Stewart extends his lead in the championship point standings to 71 points over second-place Gordon.</p>
<p>July 4, 2009</p>	<p>Stewart scores second point-paying NASCAR Cup Series victory for SHR by winning the Coke Zero 400 at Daytona International Speedway by .110 of a second over second-place Jimmie Johnson. It marks the first time a driver/owner has won multiple races in a season since Rudd in 1997 when he won at Dover International Speedway and Indianapolis Motor Speedway.</p> <p>Stewart extends his lead in the championship point standings to 180 points over second-place Gordon.</p>
<p>Aug. 10, 2009</p>	<p>Stewart scores third points-paying NASCAR Cup Series victory for SHR by winning the Heluva Good! 355k at The Glen by 2.969 seconds over second-place Marcos Ambrose. It marks the fifth win for Stewart at the Watkins Glen (N.Y.) International road course, making him the winningest driver in the track's 61-year history – a record that is unsurpassed in NASCAR, IndyCar, Formula One and sports cars.</p> <p>Stewart extends his lead in the championship point standings to 260 points over second-place Jimmie Johnson.</p>
<p>Aug. 16, 2009</p>	<p>By simply starting the CARFAX 400 at Michigan International Speedway in Brooklyn, Stewart clinches a spot in the 12-driver Chase for the Championship three races <i>before</i> the Chase begins Sept. 20 at New Hampshire Motor Speedway in Loudon. It marks the fifth time since the advent of the Chase in 2004 that Stewart has secured a spot in the Chase.</p>
<p>Sept. 12, 2009</p>	<p>By virtue of his 10th-place finish in the Chevy Rock & Roll 400 at Richmond (Va.) International Raceway – the cutoff race for the Chase for the Championship – Newman secures a spot in the Chase for the third time in his career, but first since 2005.</p> <p>With Stewart having already secured a spot in the Chase, SHR becomes the only organization to place all of its teams in the Chase. Stewart is seeded second in the Chase standings, 10 points behind series leader Mark Martin. Newman slots in at 10th, 40 points out of first.</p>
<p>Oct. 4, 2009</p>	<p>Stewart scores fourth points-paying NASCAR Cup Series victory for SHR by winning the Price Chopper 400 presented by Kraft Foods at Kansas Speedway in Kansas City, Kan., by .894 of a second over second-place Gordon. It is Stewart's second Cup Series win at Kansas and his 37th career Sprint Cup win.</p>

Oct. 23, 2009	Newman scores second NASCAR Cup Series pole for SHR in the TUMS Fast Relief 500 at Martinsville Speedway (19.563 seconds at 96.795 mph). It is Newman's third Cup Series pole at Martinsville and his 45 th career Cup Series pole.
Nov. 22, 2009	In its inaugural season, SHR places both of its cars among the top-10 in the season-ending point standings. Stewart and the No. 14 team finish sixth in points, while Newman and the No. 39 team finish ninth in points.
March 7, 2010	Newman makes 300 th career NASCAR Cup Series start in Kobalt Tools 500 at Atlanta Motor Speedway.
April 10, 2010	Newman scores fifth points-paying NASCAR Cup Series victory for SHR by winning the Subway Fresh Fit 600k at Phoenix International Raceway by .130 of a second over second-place Gordon. It is Newman's first Cup Series win at Phoenix, his 14 th career Cup Series win and his first since winning the 2008 Daytona 500 – a span of 77 races. It is also Tony Gibson's first win as a crew chief.
April 16, 2010	Stewart scores third NASCAR Cup Series pole for SHR in the Samsung Mobile 500 at Texas Motor Speedway in Fort Worth (28.224 seconds at 191.327 mph). It is Stewart's first Cup Series pole at Texas, his 11 th career Cup Series pole and his first since Oct. 21, 2005 at Martinsville Speedway – a span of 155 races.
April 19, 2010	Stewart makes 400 th career NASCAR Cup Series start in Samsung Mobile 500 at Texas Motor Speedway.
May 27, 2010	Newman scores fourth NASCAR Cup Series pole for SHR in the Coca-Cola 600 at Charlotte Motor Speedway (28.793 seconds at 187.546 mph). It is the 46 th Cup Series pole of Newman's career, and the quick time placed Newman in a tie with inaugural NASCAR Hall of Fame inductee Junior Johnson for 10 th on the all-time Cup Series pole list.
July 30, 2010	Stewart scores fifth NASCAR Cup Series pole for SHR in the Sunoco Red Cross Pennsylvania 500 at Pocono Raceway (52.511 seconds at 171.393 mph). It is Stewart's second Cup Series pole at Pocono and the 12 th of his Cup Series career.
Sept. 5, 2010	Stewart scores sixth points-paying NASCAR Cup Series victory for SHR by winning the Emory Healthcare 500 at Atlanta Motor Speedway by 1.316 seconds over second-place Carl Edwards. It is Stewart's third Cup Series win at Atlanta and his 38 th career Cup Series win. It also secured Stewart's spot in the Chase for the Championship one race <i>before</i> the Chase begins Sept. 19 at New Hampshire Motor Speedway. It marks the sixth time since the advent of the Chase in 2004 that Stewart has secured a spot in the Chase.
Oct. 10, 2010	Stewart scores seventh points-paying NASCAR Cup Series victory for SHR by winning the Pepsi Max 400 at Auto Club Speedway in Fontana, California, by .466 of a second over second-place Clint Bowyer. It is Stewart's first Cup Series win at Fontana and his 39 th career Cup Series win.

Nov. 21, 2010	Stewart and the No. 14 team finish seventh in points, while Newman and the No. 39 team finish 15 th in points.
March 6, 2011	<p>With a second-place finish in the Kobalt Tools 400 at Las Vegas Motor Speedway, Stewart jumps to the lead in the NASCAR Cup Series championship standings, but shares it with Kurt Busch. After three races, both Stewart and Busch have an average finish of 7.3.</p> <p>Newman is fifth in points, marking the first time both SHR drivers have been in the top-five in points since June 14, 2009.</p>
June 6, 2011	Matt Borland is promoted to vice president of competition, replacing former director of competition Bobby Hutchens.
July 15, 2011	<p>Newman scores sixth NASCAR Cup Series pole for SHR in the Lenox Industrial Tools 301 at New Hampshire Motor Speedway in Loudon (28.165 seconds at 135.232 mph). It is a new track record and Newman's fifth Cup Series pole at New Hampshire and the 47th of his Cup Series career.</p> <p>Stewart qualifies second to mark first time in SHR's history where drivers sweep the front row of a Cup Series race.</p>
July 17, 2011	<p>Newman scores eighth points-paying NASCAR Cup Series victory for SHR by winning the Lenox Industrial Tools 301 at New Hampshire Motor Speedway by .773 of a second over second-place Stewart. It is Newman's third Cup Series win at New Hampshire and his 15th career Cup Series win.</p> <p>The 1-2 finish is the first in SHR's history. The last time a team started 1-2 and finished 1-2 was Hendrick Motorsports in the 1989 Daytona 500. However, the last time a team started 1-2 and finished 1-2 with the <i>same</i> drivers in the <i>same</i> order was back on April 7, 1957 at North Wilkesboro (N.C.) Speedway with DePaolo Engineering. There, Fireball Roberts won from the pole, while teammate Paul Goldsmith started second and finished second. In Hendrick's instance, Darrell Waltrip won, but started second. Ken Schrader started from the pole and finished second.</p>
Aug. 25, 2011	It is announced that IndyCar Series driver Danica Patrick will run a limited NASCAR Cup Series schedule with SHR in 2012. Details regarding Patrick's car number and slate of races are not yet known.
Aug. 26, 2011	Newman scores seventh NASCAR Cup Series pole for SHR in the Irwin Tools Night Race at Bristol (Tenn.) Motor Speedway (15.624 seconds at 122.811 mph). It is Newman's third Cup Series pole at Bristol and the 48 th of his Cup Series career.
Sept. 6, 2011	By finishing 20 th in the AdvoCare 500 at Atlanta Motor Speedway, Newman clinches a spot in the 12-driver Chase for the Championship one race <i>before</i> the Chase begins Sept. 19 at Chicagoland Speedway. It marks the fourth time since the advent of the Chase in 2004 that Newman has secured a spot in the Chase.

Sept. 10, 2011	<p>By virtue of his seventh-place finish in the Wonderful Pistachios 400 at Richmond International Raceway – the cutoff race for the Chase for the Championship – Stewart secures a spot in the Chase for the seventh time in his career.</p> <p>With Newman having already secured a spot in the Chase, SHR becomes one of just two organizations to place all of its teams in the Chase, the other being Penske Racing. Newman is seeded eighth in the Chase standings, nine points behind series leader Kyle Busch. Stewart slots in at ninth, 12 points out of first.</p>
Sept. 19, 2011	<p>Stewart scores ninth points-paying NASCAR Cup Series victory for SHR by winning the Geico 400 at Chicagoland Speedway by .941 of a second over second-place Kevin Harvick. It is Stewart's series-leading third Cup Series win at Chicagoland and his 40th career Cup Series win.</p>
Sept. 23, 2011	<p>Newman scores eighth NASCAR Cup Series pole for SHR in the Sylvania 300 at New Hampshire Motor Speedway (28.213 seconds at 135.002 mph). It is Newman's series-leading sixth Cup Series pole at New Hampshire and the 49th of his Cup Series career. The fast time also gave Newman a sweep of the Cup Series poles at New Hampshire in 2011, as he broke the track record with his pole run for July's Lenox Industrial Tools 301.</p>
Sept. 25, 2011	<p>Stewart scores 10th points-paying NASCAR Cup Series victory for SHR by winning the Sylvania 300 at New Hampshire Motor Speedway by 7.225 seconds over second-place Brad Keselowski. It is Stewart's third Cup Series win at New Hampshire and his 41st career Cup Series win. And with the victory at Chicagoland Speedway on Sept. 19, it marked the eighth time Stewart has scored back-to-back wins in his Cup Series career, with the previous occurrence coming in July 2007 when he won back-to-back races at Chicagoland Speedway and Indianapolis Motor Speedway. And by winning the first two races of the Chase, Stewart became just the second driver in the eight-year history of the Chase to open the Chase with consecutive wins. Greg Biffle was the first, winning at New Hampshire Motor Speedway and Dover International Speedway in 2008.</p> <p>With Stewart's September win and Newman's July win at New Hampshire Motor Speedway, SHR sweeps the track's 2011 slate of Cup Series races. It marks the first time in SHR's history where the team has completed a sweep. Making the achievement even more impressive is that with Newman having swept the track's two Cup Series poles 2011, SHR made a clean sweep of each of New Hampshire's Cup Series race weekends.</p>
Oct. 13, 2011	<p>Stewart scores ninth NASCAR Cup Series pole for SHR in the Bank of America 500 at Charlotte Motor Speedway (28.131 seconds at 191.959 mph). It is Stewart's first Cup Series pole at Charlotte and the 13th of his Cup Series career.</p>
Oct. 30, 2011	<p>Stewart scores 11th points-paying NASCAR Cup Series victory for SHR by winning the TUMS Fast Relief 500 at Martinsville Speedway by .170 of a second over second-place Jimmie Johnson. It is Stewart's third Cup Series win at Martinsville and his 42nd career Cup Series win.</p>
Nov. 4, 2011	<p>In a press conference at Texas Motor Speedway, Stewart announces Patrick's 10-race NASCAR Cup Series schedule for 2012 and unveils her car number (10).</p>

Nov. 7, 2011	<p>Stewart scores 12th points-paying NASCAR Cup Series victory for SHR by winning the AAA Texas 500 at Texas Motor Speedway by 1.092 seconds over second-place Carl Edwards. It is Stewart's second Cup Series win at Texas and his 43rd career Cup Series win. And with the victory at Martinsville Speedway on Oct. 30, it marked the ninth time Stewart has scored back-to-back wins in his Cup Series career, with the previous occurrence coming just a month earlier when he won back-to-back races at New Hampshire Motor Speedway and Chicagoland Speedway.</p>
Nov. 20, 2011	<p>Stewart scores 13th points-paying NASCAR Cup Series victory for SHR by winning the season-ending Ford 400 at Homestead-Miami Speedway by 1.306 seconds over second-place Carl Edwards. It is Stewart's third Cup Series win at Homestead and his 44th career Cup Series win.</p> <p>With the victory, Stewart ends the season in a numerical tie with Edwards, as each driver has 2,403 points. But Stewart wins the 2011 title by virtue of a tiebreaker, as his five wins on the season trump Edwards' one. It is the closest Cup Series championship battle in NASCAR history. It is Stewart's third Cup Series championship, but his first as a driver/owner and the first for SHR. The last driver/owner to win a Cup Series title was Alan Kulwicki in 1992.</p>
Nov. 28, 2011	<p>Steve Addington is announced as the new crew chief for Stewart and the No. 14 team, replacing Darian Grubb.</p>
Dec. 2, 2011	<p>Stewart and the No. 14 team of SHR are officially recognized as the 2011 NASCAR Cup Series champions during the annual awards banquet at the Wynn Resort and Casino in Las Vegas.</p>
Dec. 16, 2011	<p>Greg Zipadelli named competition director, joining SHR after a 13-year tenure with Joe Gibbs Racing, where he served as Stewart's NASCAR Cup Series crew chief from 1999 through 2008.</p>
Feb. 23, 2012	<p>Stewart wins the non-points Gatorade Duel race at Daytona International Speedway.</p>
March 11, 2012	<p>Stewart scores 14th points-paying NASCAR Cup Series victory for SHR by winning the Kobalt Tools 400 at Las Vegas Motor Speedway by .461 of a second over second-place Jimmie Johnson. It is Stewart's first Cup Series win at Las Vegas and his 45th career Cup Series win.</p>
March 22, 2012	<p>Brett Froad, executive vice president at SHR, named to the 2012 Forty Under 40 Class at a gala dinner and awards program at the Ritz-Carlton, Laguna Niguel following the IMG World Congress of Sports. The Forty Under 40 Awards program was initiated in 1999 by Street & Smith's <i>SportsBusiness Journal</i> and <i>SportsBusiness Daily</i> to identify and honor the most promising young executives in sports business under the age of 40. A committee of <i>SportsBusiness Journal</i> and <i>SportsBusiness Daily</i> editors and writers select the 40 executives from among hundreds of nominations received each year.</p>
March 25, 2012	<p>Stewart scores 15th points-paying NASCAR Cup Series victory for SHR by winning the Auto Club 400 at Auto Club Speedway in Fontana, California, in a race shortened by rain. It is Stewart's second Cup Series win at Fontana and his 46th career Cup Series win, tying him with 1956 and 1957 Cup Series champion Buck Baker for 14th on the all-time series win list.</p>

April 1, 2012	Newman scores 16 th points-paying NASCAR Cup Series victory for SHR by winning the Goody's Fast Relief 500 at Martinsville Speedway by .342 of a second over second-place A.J. Allmendinger. It is Newman's first Cup Series win at Martinsville and his 16 th career Cup Series win.
July 7, 2012	Stewart scores 17 th points-paying NASCAR Cup Series victory for SHR by winning the Coke Zero 400 at Daytona International Speedway under caution over second-place Jeff Burton. It is Stewart's fourth points-paying Cup Series win at Daytona and his 47 th career Cup Series win.
Aug. 31, 2012	Stewart scores 10 th NASCAR Cup Series pole for SHR in the AdvoCare 500 at Atlanta Motor Speedway (29.787 seconds at 186.121 mph). It is Stewart's first Cup Series pole at Atlanta and the 14 th of his Cup Series career.
Sept. 8, 2012	By virtue of his fourth-place finish in the Federated Auto Parts 400 at Richmond International Raceway – the cutoff race for the Chase for the Championship – Stewart secures a spot in the Chase for the eighth time in his career.
Oct. 19, 2012	It is announced that Tony Gibson will move from the No. 39 team to the No. 10 team to serve as crew chief for Patrick. Matt Borland will add to his duties as vice president of competition by becoming crew chief of the No. 39 team and Newman.
Oct. 21, 2012	Newman makes 400 th career NASCAR Cup Series start in Hollywood Casino 400 at Kansas Speedway.
Oct. 28, 2012	Matt Borland's first race as crew chief for No. 39 team and Newman – the TUMS Fast Relief 500 at Martinsville Speedway.
Nov. 4, 2012	Tony Gibson's first race as crew chief for No. 10 team and Patrick – the AAA Texas 500 at Texas Motor Speedway.
Nov. 18, 2012	Stewart makes 500 th career NASCAR Cup Series start in Ford EcoBoost 400 at Homestead-Miami Speedway. Stewart and the No. 14 team finish ninth in points, while Newman and the No. 39 team finish 14 th in points.
Feb. 17, 2013	Patrick scores 11 th NASCAR Cup Series pole for SHR in the 55 th Daytona 500 at Daytona International Speedway (45.817 seconds at 196.434 mph). It is Patrick's first career Cup Series pole and the first Cup Series pole earned by a woman.
June 2, 2013	Stewart scores 18 th points-paying NASCAR Cup Series victory for SHR by winning the FedEx 400 benefiting Autism Speaks at Dover International Speedway by .788 of a second over second-place Juan Pablo Montoya. It is Stewart's third Cup Series win at Dover and his 48 th career Cup Series win.

July 12, 2013	It is announced that Kevin Harvick will join SHR beginning in 2014, driving the No. 4 Chevrolet. It is also announced that Newman will not return to the organization in 2014.
July 27, 2013	Newman scores 12th NASCAR Cup Series pole for SHR in the 20th Brickyard 400 at Indianapolis Motor Speedway (47.992 seconds at 187.531 mph). Newman sets a new track qualifying record en route to earning his milestone 50 th career Cup Series pole. It is his first pole at Indianapolis.
July 28, 2013	Newman scores 19th points-paying NASCAR Cup Series victory for SHR by winning the Brickyard 400 at Indianapolis Motor Speedway from the pole by 2.657 seconds over second-place Jimmie Johnson. It is Newman's first Cup Series win at Indianapolis and his 17 th career Cup Series win.
Aug. 5, 2013	Stewart sustains a broken right tibia and fibula in a sprint car crash at Southern Iowa Speedway in Oskaloosa, Iowa, putting him out of the No. 14 car for an indefinite period of time.
Aug. 8, 2013	Max Papis is named interim driver of the No. 14 car for the Aug. 11 355k at The Glen at Watkins Glen International.
Aug. 11, 2013	Papis starts 29 th and finishes 15 th in the No. 14 car in the 355k at The Glen at Watkins Glen International. Stewart's consecutive streak of NASCAR Cup Series starts ends at 521 races.
Aug. 12, 2013	Austin Dillon is named interim driver of the No. 14 car for the Aug. 18 Pure Michigan 400 at Michigan International Speedway.
Aug. 18, 2013	Dillon starts 27 th and finishes 14 th in the No. 14 car in the Pure Michigan 400 at Michigan International Speedway.
Aug. 19, 2013	Mark Martin is named interim driver of the No. 14 car for 12 of the 13 remaining races on the 2013 NASCAR Cup Series schedule. Dillon will drive No. 14 car Oct. 20 at Talladega Superspeedway. Stewart officially out for remainder of 2013 season as he recovers from a broken right tibia and fibula suffered in a sprint car crash Aug. 5 at Southern Iowa Speedway in Oskaloosa, Iowa.
Aug. 24, 2013	Martin starts 11 th and finishes 20 th in the No. 14 car in the Irwin Tools Night Race at Bristol Motor Speedway.
