



# Schatz Earns 20<sup>th</sup> WoO Win of 2013

*Tony Stewart Racing Teammates Close Midwest Tour with Solid Finishes*

Tony Stewart Racing's (TSR) Donny Schatz continued his remarkable 2013 World of Outlaws (WoO) STP Sprint Car Series campaign this past weekend by earning his 20<sup>th</sup> A-Feature win of the season Friday at Clay County Fair Speedway in Spencer, Iowa. The driver of the TSR No. 15 STP/Armor All/Chevrolet Performance J&J dominated the 30-lap race at the Arnold Supply Motor Supply Shootout, leading from start to finish.

The win established a new career high for Schatz, who became the sixth driver in WoO history to win 20 A-Features in a season. The five-time and reigning WoO STP Sprint Car Series champion followed Friday's triumph with a charge from 12<sup>th</sup> to sixth at Deer Creek Speedway in Spring Valley, Minn., keeping himself within striking distance of championship leader Daryn Pittman with eight races remaining.

TSR's Steve Kinser picked up his ninth top-five finish of the season Saturday at Deer Creek, racing the TSR No. 11 Bad Boy Buggies/J.D. Byrider/Chevrolet Performance Maxim to a fourth-place finish. It was his sixth top-10 in his last eight starts, keeping the 20-time WoO champion eighth in the standings.

Schatz entered Friday's race at Clay County as a three-time winner at the 3/8-mile clay oval in northwest Iowa. The Fargo, N.D., racer qualified eighth in the field of 27 cars before finishing second to Kerry Madsen in both the second heat and the dash. Schatz got the jump at the start of 30-lap A-Feature and was never challenged en route to his 144<sup>th</sup> career WoO A-Feature victory.

Kinser's night at Clay County was a frustrating one. After qualifying 15<sup>th</sup> and finishing fourth in heat three, "The King of the Outlaws" started the 30-lap A-Feature 15<sup>th</sup> and finished in the same position.

He bounced back Saturday at Deer Creek by turning the second-fastest lap in qualifying around the high-banked, 3/8-mile dirt oval. He finished third in the second heat and sixth in the dash to earn an outside third-row starting spot in the 35-lap A-Feature. Kinser made his way up to fourth during the quickly moving race, but could climb no higher.

Schatz was looking to earn his 21<sup>st</sup> victory of the season and third weekend sweep in 2013 at Deer Creek. He qualified sixth overall and finished fourth in his heat to transfer into the A-Feature. Schatz raced from 12<sup>th</sup> to sixth in the A-Feature and earned his eighth KSE Hard Charger Award.

With 67 races completed in 2013, Schatz ranks second in the championship standings and trails Pittman by 70 points with eight races remaining. Next up for Schatz and Kinser is a doubleheader beginning Friday at Tony Stewart's Eldora Speedway in Rossburg, Ohio. Friday's Outlaw race opens the 32<sup>nd</sup> annual 4-Crown Nationals at Eldora, followed by Saturday's Commonwealth Clash at Lernerville Speedway in Sarver, Pa.
